WARNING: Misuse may create a fire hazard

 Keep these instructions in a safe and accessible place for future reference.

Intended application

 Built in use only: Do not use on a counter-top or inside a cupboard.

This microwave is intended for use in household and domestic applications such as...

- staff kitchen areas in shops ,offices and other working environments;
- use by clients in hotels, and...
- other residential type environments.
- Farm houses and bed and breakfast type environments.

This microwave is not intended for outdoor or commercial use.

- The microwave may be used by people with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience or knowledge, if they are supervised whilst using it or have been shown how to use it safely and recognise and understand the consequences of incorrect operation.
- See guarantee for definition of domestic use.

General safety



This microwave is intended for heating food and beverages only.



Drying of footwear or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloths and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.



Only a suitably qualified person must install this appliance or replace the mains cable.



WARNING! Accessible parts may become hot during use.



Always use oven gloves to remove or put in accessories or oven-ware.

Do not heat liquids and other foods in sealed containers. They are liable to explode.



Microwave heating beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling. Care must be taken when handling the liquids' container.



Contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars must be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption, in order to avoid burns.



Eggs in their shell and whole hardboiled eggs should not be heated in the microwave since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.



Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens.



When heating food in plastic or paper containers, monitor the appliance due to the possibility of ignition.



If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance. Keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.



Before carrying out any maintenance, disconnect the appliance from the power supply.



Ensure that the appliance is switched off before replacing the lamp to avoid the possibility of electric shock.



If the mains power supply cable is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, Authorised Service Centre or similarly qualified persons to avoid electrical hazard.



Do not use the appliance when it is empty. Metal parts inside the cooking compartment can create arcing and damage the oven.



Metallic containers for food and beverages must not be used for microwave cooking. (This requirement is not applicable if the manufacturer specifies size and shape of metallic containers suitable for microwave cooking).

WARNING: If the door or door seals are damaged, the appliance must not be operated until it has been repaired by a qualified person.



Only a qualified person can carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover that gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.



Do not attempt to use the appliance with the door open. This can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. **DO NOT** tamper or break the safety interlocks.



If the appliance is not maintained in a good state of cleanliness, its surfaces could degrade and affect the lifespan of the product and may lead to malfunction.



Do not place any object between the oven front face and door or allow soiling or cleaning residue to accumulate on these closing, sealing surfaces.

Safety with children



កូន្ត This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.



Children aged 3 years and under must be kept away at all times from the appliance when it is in operation.

- Children must not be allowed to clean or maintain the microwave unsupervised.
- The appliance is not to be used by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.
- Please supervise children in the vicinity of the microwave and do not let them play with it.
- All children should be supervised when the oven is used in combination mode due to the high temperatures generated.
- Please keep all packaging away from children and dispose of it appropriately.

Keep appliance and power cord away from children below 8 years old.

Use the child lock when required.



Keep children and pets away from the appliance when it operates or when it cools down. Accessible



parts may be hot.

Electrical safety



Touching some of the internal components can cause serious personal injury or death.

WARNING: Do not disassemble this appliance. Improper use of the arounding can result in electric shock.

Grounding

- The appliance must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current
- Only connect the microwave to a grounded outlet/line with the voltage and protection as specified in the "Technical Specifications".

Power cord & extensions

- The power cord has a grounding wire with a grounding plug.
- If damaged it must be replaced by

the manufacturer, LAMONA service engineer or suitably qualified person.

The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

- If you must use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord.
- The short power-supply cord is provided to reduce risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord.
- If a long cord set or extension cord is used:

The marked electrical rating of the cord set or extension cord should be at least as great as the electrical rating of the appliance.

The extension cord must be a grounded-type 3-wire cord.

 Arrange the cord so that it will not drape over the counter top or tabletop where it can be pulled on by children or tripped over.

Safety in use



Use oven gloves when placing or removing cookware.



Do not operate the appliance when it is empty.



The appliance and its accessible parts may become hot during use. Take care when removing

or installing accessories. Avoid touching the grill elements.



If the microwave is mounted at height, take care removing hot cookware, especially with liquids.



Open the door carefully. Use of ingredients containing alcohol can come into contact with hot surfaces or mix with air and ignite.



Take care when opening the door, hot air / steam may be released.



Do not operate the appliance with wet hands or if it has been in contact with water.



Do not put flammable products or items that are wet, in or near the microwave.



Ensure ventilation openings are clear from blockage.



Set the kitchen Timer to 0 after each use to prevent the microwave operating when empty.

- Do not use the microwave function to pre-heat the oven.
- Do not leave the appliance unattended during operation.
- Do not put pressure on the appliance door when it is open.
- Do not let sparks / open flames come in contact with the microwave when you open the door.

- Do not put aluminium foil directly under the appliance.
- Do not put water directly into the hot appliance.
- Do not keep moist dishes and food in the appliance after you have finished cooking.

Precautions to avoid possible exposure to excessive microwave energy

 It is hazardous for anyone other than a qualified or competent person to carry out any service or repair that involves removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.



Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since this can result in harmful exposure to excessive microwaye radiation.



Do not place any object between the oven front face and door or allow soiling or cleaning residue to accumulate on these closing and sealing surfaces.



Do not break or tamper with the safety interlocks.

If door/door seals are damaged, do not operate the oven until repaired by a competent person.



If the appliance is not maintained in a good state of cleanliness, its surface could be degraded which may affect the lifespan of the product and lead to malfunction.

2. Microwave cooking, a general guide

Remove aluminium foil packaging from metal containers etc. before you prepare the food for heating.

- Put the food on a plate on the turntable unless specified differently.
- After cooking let food stand for some time
- If possible, always stir the food before serving.
- Where possible, cook food covered with material suitable for microwave use. Only cook food without a cover if you want to keep a crust.
- Do not overcook dishes by setting the power and time too high. The food can dry out, burn or catch fire.
- Do not use the appliance to cook eggs in their shells, as they can explode. even when cooking has ended.

- Pierce skin or peel potatoes, tomatoes, sausages and similar types of food with a fork, several times before cooking to prevent food bursting open.
- For chilled/frozen food, set a longer cooking time at a lower power.

Do not heat foodstuffs in sealed containers, they are could explode!

- Dishes containing sauce must be stirred from time to time.
- Turn larger pieces of food over after half the cooking time.
- If possible, cut vegetables into similar sized pieces.
- Use flat, wide dishes.

Do not use cookware made of porcelain, ceramic or earthenware with unglazed bottoms, or small holes (for example on handles). Moisture can penetrate the holes and cause the cookware to become very hot. The cookware may crack.

Defrosting meat, poultry & fish:

• Put the frozen, unwrapped food on a small upturned plate with a container below it or on a defrosting rack or plastic sieve so that the defrosting liquid can run off.

 Turn the food after half the defrosting time. If possible divide, then remove pieces that have started to defrost.



Defrosting butter & portions of aateau:

• Do not fully defrost in the appliance. but let them defrost completely at room temperature. This gives a more even result. Remove all metal or aluminium packaging or parts before defrosting.



Defrosting fruit & vegetables.

- If fruit and vegetables are not to be cooked completely, do not defrost them fully in the microwave but let them defrost completely at room temperature.
- To cook fruit and vegetables without defrosting them first, you can use a high microwave power.



Ready meals:



Ready meals in metal packaging or plastic trays with metal covers can only be defrosted or heated in the microwave if they are expressly designated as suitable for use in the microwave.

Follow the manufacturer's instructions printed on the packaging (e.g. remove cover / pierce the plastic film).

Cookware you can use in the microwave



Utensils	Remarks
Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of a browning dish must be at least 3/16 inch (5mm) above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.
Dinnerware	Use microwave-safe cookware only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Glass jars	Always remove the lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.
Glassware	Use heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.
Paper plates/cups	Use these for short-term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for short-term cooking only.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.
Plastic	Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. These should be labelled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften as the food inside gets hotter. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by the product instructions.
Plastic wrap	Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow the plastic wrap to touch food.
Thermometers	Use microwave-safe thermometers only.
Wax paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture.




Utensils	Remarks	
Aluminium tray /foil	May cause arcing. Transfer food into a microwave-safe dish.	
Food carton with metal handle	May cause arcing. Transfer food into a microwave-safe dish.	
Metal or metal-trimmed utensils	Metal, shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause arcing.	
Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.	
Paper bags	May ignite and start a fire in the oven.	
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.	
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.




Turntable Installation




- Never use the oven without the turntable. It can rotate clockwise & anticlockwise.
- Never restrict the movement of the turntable.
- Both glass tray & turntable ring must always be used during cooking.
- Always place food for cooking on the glass tray.
- If the glass tray or turntable ring cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorised service centre.

Speed cooking (100 % Power)

- The Speed Cooking function allows rapid cooking at 100% power. Cooking time can be increased easily in multiples of 30 seconds.
- Maximum cooking time using this function is 95 minutes.
- Speed cooking cannot be set during the "Defrost by Weight", or "Auto Menu" functions.
- (1) Touching



repeatedly increases speed cooking time by 30 seconds.



Both power and microwave indications flash as the cooking time counts down.



Cooking begins immediately using 100% power on the first touch.

If cooking time has already elapsed after the first touch, additional touches will add 30 seconds to the elapsed time.



Cooking using the grill



When grilling is 50% complete 2 alert tones (1)) will sound to remind you to turn the food over. If no other input is made, grilling will continue until the cooking time elapses.



(1)) 5 tones sound when grilling is ends.



Defrost by weight (Cooking time is set automatically)



2 Touch/Swipe to set the food weight (0.1 to 2kg).



3 Touch



to start defrosting. The indicators flash as the time counts down.

1 Touch 3 timesThe display shows......

When progress reaches 50% (1)) 2 alert tones will sound. Turn the food over at this point. After a few seconds, defrosting will continue until the time elapses.

The defrost power cannot be changed.

(1) 5 tones sound when defrosting is complete.





7. Trouble Shooting

During normal operation the following observations are normal		
When cooking, the microwave interferes with TV reception.	If the microwave is close to a radio or TV; reception may be impaired, this is normal.	
The oven light is dim.	If cooking using a low power setting, the light may become dim. This is normal.	
Steam is coming out of the vents . Condensation is also accumulating on the door.	During cooking steam can be generated. Most will be evacuated through the vents, though some may settle on a colder surface, such as the oven door. This is normal.	

Problem	Possible Cause	Remedy
The microwave will not switch on.	The power cord is not plugged in tightly.	Unplug, then plug in again (after 10 seconds).
	The plug fuse has blown or the circuit breaker has tripped.	Replace the fuse or reset the circuit breaker (carried out by a competent qualified person).
	The power outlet is not supplying power.	Test the outlet with other electrical appliances e.g. a lamp.
The microwave is not heating properly.	I closed and is sealing	



WARNING: If the door or door seals are damaged the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.

8. Care & Maintenance



The microwave must be unplugged from the power supply socket before cleaning.



If the appliance is not maintained in a good state of cleanliness, its surfaces could be damaged. This may affect the lifespan of the product and could lead to malfunction.



The appliance should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed immediately after cooking.



Leave the door open after cooking to allow any condensation to evaporate.



Allow the oven to cool before cleaning.

Cleaning the cooking compartment



Clean the cooking compartment after use with a slightly damp cloth. Do not use steel wool pads. Clean accessories with soapy water



For easy cleaning of the cooking compartment. Place half a lemon in 300ml (1/2 pint) of water and heat for 10 minutes at 100% microwave power. Wipe clean with a soft dry cloth:

Door contact surfaces and neighbouring parts



Clean the door frame, contact surfaces and neighbouring parts carefully with a damp cloth.





Take care not to scratch any glass and brushed steel bezel.

Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the glass door since they can scratch the surface, which may result in the glass shattering.



Do not use a steam cleaner to clean the appliance.



Discolouration of the enamel or stainless steel has no effect on the performance of the appliance.

- Use a deep pan for moist cakes.
- Fruit juices can cause stains that can be permanent.

Cleaning the accessories



Remove the glass tray and turntable ring. Clean with soapy water.

Utensil Test



See page 11, for information on microwave safe materials. If in doubt, test the utensil using the procedure below.

- Fill a microwave safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- 2. Cook for 1 minute at 100% power.
- **3.** Feel the utensil. If it is warm, DO NOT use it for microwave cooking.



WARNING: DO NOT exceed 1 minute cooking time.

Service



To ensure continued safe and efficient operation of the appliance, we recommend that any servicing or repairs are only carried out by an

authorised LAMONA service engineer as this may involve removal of a cover giving protection against exposure to microwave energy.

9. Installation



Please read this manual carefully before installation

This appliance is intended for domestic use only.



The appliance is heavy. Take care when moving it.



Always use safety gloves and enclosed footwear.

WARNING! Only a suitably competent / qualified person must install this appliance.

- This oven is for built-in use only. Do not install behind a decorative door.
- It is not intended for counter-top use or for use inside a cupboard.



Remove all packaging.



Do not pull or lift the appliance by the door.

 Maintain minimum distances from other appliances and units.



Do not install or use the appliance if it appears to be damaged.

Electrical Connections

 Electrical connection must be made by a suitably qualified person. The product must be installed in accordance with all local regulations.



The appliance must be earthed.

 The appliance is fitted with a plug and must only be connected to a properly installed, earthed socket in accordance with the appropriate regulations.

The mains supply voltage must correspond to the voltage specified on the rating plate. See specifications on page 30.

- The socket must be installed by a qualified electrician.
- The power cable must only be replaced by a qualified electrician.

If the plug is no longer accessible following installation, an all-pole disconnecting device must be present on the installation side with a contact gap of at least 3mm.




Adapters, multi-way strips and extension leads must not be used. Overloading can result in a risk of fire.





Accessible surfaces may be hot during operation.

Appliance Dimensions



All dimensions shown in millimetres.



The appliance must be correctly ventilated.




Minimum installation height is 850mm.

Do not position or use under a work surface. The appliance must not be subjected to spillages from containers onto surfaces under which the appliance is installed.



Do not cover ventilation slots and air intakes points.





Take care not to trap or bend the power cord.



Depending upon the installation, it might be necessary to fix the position of the power cable on the back of the microwave, using adhesive tape.





Standard appliance tower shown with shelves adjusted as shown at **(3)**.




1. Remove back panel support from the cabinet service void.

Cut down to provide adequate ventilation. The microwave and <u>service</u> void must be properly maintained.





2. Remove the back panel. Once shelf positions are established, mark and cut to provide suitable ventilation.










Service void and ventilation

The cabinet must allow ventilation behind the microwave. The service void must be maintained and kept free from blockage.



Position and install



Take care not to scratch the glass, brushed steel control panel and door when installing. Remove all accessories from the oven cavity.


Open the oven door. Use the supplied fixing screws to fix the appliance to the front of the cabinet.

1. Insert the microwave until the frame abuts the front of the cabinet.



2. Ensure the microwave is centred.

11. Environmental Care



The environmentally friendly, recyclable packaging is designed to protect the appliance from damage during transportation. All packaging materials should be recycled.

> Recycling reduces the use of raw materials in the manufacturina process and also reduces the amount of waste in landfill sites.

Disposing of your old appliance

- To ensure safe disposal, disconnect the mains plug from the socket. Cut the mains power cable and destroy this and the plug.
